SUNDAY SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

April 7, 2019 – 5th Sunday of Lent: Today, we see the mercy of God. This mercy seeks to heal what has been broken by sin and thus to restore all things in harmony with God's divine justice. {John 8:1-11}

April 14, 2019 – Passion (Palm) Sunday: We see the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem followed by his suffering, death, and resurrection. We walk with Jesus through Holy Week in the pattern of his death and resurrection to renew our baptismal commitment. {Luke 19: 28-40, Luke 22: 14-23}

April 21, 2019 – Easter Sunday: We tend to see faith more as a possession that can be lost than a relationship that will wither due to lack of nourishment. In fact, in a sense faith is both, but the relationship comes first and must keep growing. {John 20: 1-9}

April 28, 2019 – 2nd Sunday of Easter: Today's Gospel and the reading from the Acts of the Apostles show how deeply afraid the disciples were. Yet Jesus comes twice in that upper room wishing them peace and telling them, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." {Acts 5: 12-16, John 20: 19-31}
