SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

March 3, 2019 – 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Jesus leveled especially severe criticism to those who hypocritically judge others for the very faults often found in their own lives. (Luke 6: 39-45)

March 10, 2019 – 1st Sunday in Lent: The spiritual desert is a terrible and wonderful place filled with marvelous grace – if we are open to it. Lent is an opportunity for us to ask for and receive that grace. (Luke 4: 1-13)

March 17, 2019 – 2nd Sunday of Lent: God's actions in our lives often surprise and amaze us, disrupting a sense that we are in control. How often do we quiet ourselves to hear God's word of promise and fulfillment? (Luke 9: 28b-36)

March 24, 2019- 3rd Sunday of Lent: Easter is three weeks away. Lent is a quiet time of the year; a time for reflection, a time for sincere change in ourselves, a time for prayerful self-reflection, a time to become closer to our loving and forgiving God. (Luke 13: 1-9)

March 31, 2019 – 4th Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday): Christ has removed all barriers between us and the loving Father. If there is anything in our hearts that separates us from God, Lent is a good time to be reconciled and know the joy of coming home. (Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32)



Above all, trust in the slow work of God.
We are quite naturally impatient in everything to reach the end without delay.
We should like to skip the intermediate stages.
We are impatient of being on the way to something unknown, something new.
And yet it is the law of all progress that it is made by passing through some stages of instability—and that it may take a very long time.

And so I think it is with you; your ideas mature gradually—let them grow, let them shape themselves, without undue haste. Don't try to force them on, as though you could be today what time (that is to say, grace and circumstances acting on your own good will) will make of you tomorrow.

Only God could say what this new spirit gradually forming within you will be. Give Our Lord the benefit of believing that his hand is leading you, and accept the anxiety of feeling yourself in suspense and incomplete.
